What is an Abdominal X-Ray?

An x-ray of the stomach or abdomen is when pictures are taken of the inside of your body. An abdominal x ray takes pictures of the structures and organs in the abdomen. When you go to get an x-ray of your stomach, this is what will happen:

- 1. You go the desk to tell them you have come
- 2. You might have to sit and wait.
- 3. When asked, you will need to take off your clothes and put a gown on. You may be allowed to keep on your underwear if it has no metal clips or pins on it.
- 4. You will walk into an x-ray room
- 5. The radio technician will help you to lie on your back on a table.
- 6. A lead screen may be placed over your pelvis to stop radiation.
- 7. The x-ray machine is put over your stomach. You need to lie very still.
- 8. You will be asked to hold your breath for 1-2 seconds. This is very important because if you move, the pictures will blur.
- 9. The x-ray will be taken. A beep sound may be heard: nothing touches or hurts you when the x-ray is taken. You will be asked to stand up.
- 10. You may be asked to stand up for another picture. Sometimes an erect film is not required.
- 11. You will be asked to hold your breath for just a few seconds. The x-ray will be taken.
- 12. You may be asked to turn around and put your arms up
- 13. You will be asked to hold your breath for just a few seconds. The x-ray will be taken.
- 14. You might have to sit and wait in the change room while the x-rays are checked
- 15. The radio technician or nurse will tell you that the pictures are OK. You will put your clothes back on.
- 16. You can then go home.
